The Business Development Grant is designed to provide capital to small businesses and non-profits with fewer than 150 employees. The grant aims to support projects that increase capacity, add new ventures, or expand existing operations. Eligible uses include acquiring equipment, technology, permits, or site development necessary for business growth. The grant cannot be used for payroll, legal fees, utilities, insurance, or taxes.
